Articulation: A type of attack used to play a note or group of notes. (located above or below the note head)

- 1.) Legato (): smooth & connected
- 2.) Tenuto (): to hold full value
- 3.) Staccato (): short
- 4.) Accent (): to emphasize
- 5.) Marcato (): Heavy, marked (march like) style.
- 6.) Sforzando (sfz): strong accent
- 7.) Slur (**): Curved line connecting notes of different pitch. Tongue only the first note in a slur.

Dynamics Study Guide

Dynamics: Loudness or softness of music. (Located underneath the notes)

- 1.) Pianississimo (ppp) very, very soft
- 2.) Pianissimo (pp): very soft
- 3.) Piano (p): soft
- 4.) Mezzo piano (mp): moderately soft
- 5.) Mezzo forte (**mf**): moderately loud
- 6.) Forte (**f**): loud
- 7.) Fortissimo (ff): very loud
- 8.) Fortississimo (fff) very, very loud
- 9.) Fortepiano (fp): loud, then soft
- 10.) Crescendo (_____): gradually playing louder
- 11.) Decrescendo (_____): gradually playing softer
- 10.) Diminuendo: (_____): gradually playing softer
- 11.) Subito Piano (sub.): suddenly soft
